
# FEtC-H assessment procedure for new research







# Faculty Ethics assessment Commitee Humanities

The Faculty Ethics assessment Committee – Humanities (FEtC-H) was established in order to assist Faculty of Humanities researchers in complying with the changing quality requirements.

# Why?

To an increasing degree, researchers are expected not only to weigh up the ethical acceptability of their research themselves, but also to submit their research to the competent committee for prior ethical assessment. While such a formal ethical assessment may sometimes be required due to changes in the legal frameworks, it is increasingly stipulated as a condition by grant providers and the editorial staff of journals.

The Faculty Ethics assessment Committee – Humanities (hereinafter: FEtC-H) was established to assist Faculty of Humanities researchers in complying with these changing quality requirements and to ensure that all Faculty of Humanities research is carried out according to similar, proper and ethically responsible procedures.

## Who?

Researchers affiliated with one of the Faculty of Humanities research institutes (the Institute for Cultural Inquiry (ICON), the Research Institute for Philosophy and Religious Studies (OFR), the Research Institute for History and Art History (OGK) and the Utrecht Institute of Linquistics OTS (UiL OTS)).

# Which research must be registered?



#### REQUIRED

All new research in which data regarding human behaviour will be collected from one or more participants, to be conducted by researchers/ guest researchers under the banner of the Faculty of Humanities.



All research for which the UiL OTS lab or trial subject database will be used.



### **NOT REQUIRED**

Research that will be conducted without the involvement of participants, such as an analysis of existing corpora or other databases previously created for use in academic research.




Preliminary research, unless these participants will be reported on separately in the methods section of a publication (see the regulations).



Research conducted by students; for exceptions, please check the FEtC-H education brochure on the intranet.

## How?

The FEtC-H has two chambers: the General Chamber (GC) and the Linguistics Chamber (LC). The chambers each have their own committee members, but they have a single, joint secretary (see the website).
